One day she says, 'We're poor and hungry. Why don't you leave here and find work? We need money for food and clothes.'

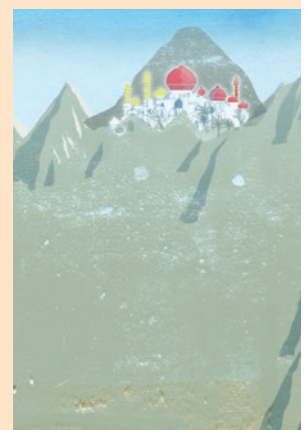
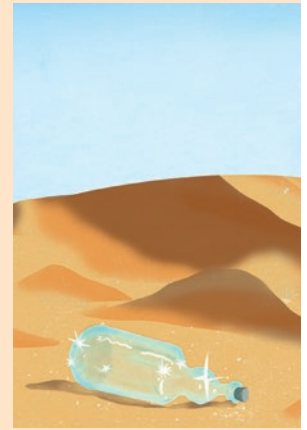
'If you want some money, you have your silver ring – you can sell that,' answers Walid.

## Part 2
