Wetsuits by Jack

Uncle Joe in his wetsuit

A wetsuit is a special kind of clothes. People wear wetsuits for watersports like surfing, diving and windsurfing.

what it's used for

A wetsuit is made of rubber, usually a man-made rubber called neoprene. Scientists invented neoprene in 1930.

what it's made of

Before wetsuits, people became cold in the sea very quickly. A wetsuit keeps you warm, so you can spend hours in the sea!

why it's special

A wetsuit has to fit you well to keep you warm. You can wear swimming shorts under your wetsuit.


The Romans built strong walls around their towns to protect them. Soldiers guarded the gates.

There were public toilets in the town. There were up to 30 toilets in one room.
