Reading

Saving the future of food on Earth

The Svalbard Global Seed Vault is a special kind of bank. There is no money or gold inside. It is used to store seed samples for all the crops that people grow for food around the world.

Norway spent around 9 million US dollars to build the facility, but they welcome any country that wishes to keep seeds there safely until they need them again.

Svalbard is a part of Norway. It is a group of islands near the North Pole where the climate is always cold. Cold is great for storing seeds. The temperature rarely rises above 5 degrees in summer, and always remains below zero in winter. And there is plenty of coal on the islands, providing a good source of energy. There are daily flights there from mainland Norway.

The Seed Vault is a large building inside a rocky mountain, 120 metres from the surface. The three large storage rooms where they keep the seeds are each about 27 metres long, 10 metres wide and 6 metres high.

The world is getting smaller. It's easier than ever before in history to travel. We get to meet people from diverse cultures. When I was younger, my homeland used to get visitors from just a handful of countries – now tourists come from all over the world. But what happens when our behaviour doesn't match what another culture expects?
